

• Library Resources Exhibition: Wisdom of Rivers (16-30 November 2010)



The Library proudly presented the **Riverside Scene at Qingming Festival** 《清明上河圖》 of Northern Song Dynasty (art reproduction) together with a slide collection of western paintings inspired by rivers of the centuries from 16 to 30 November 2010.

The exhibition attracted a lot of library users as it was the hottest topic in the city. The juxtaposition of the river's paintings from the East and the West enabled our viewers to travel through space and time, together with artifacts like the Slide Carousel Projector which our students found it very interesting. The exhibition was a successful one which generated lots of interest on the subject, as shown by the positive feedbacks received on the guestbook. It provided us a good opportunity to promote the Library's collection in the Media Services Section including slides, CD-ROM, DVDs and the Special Collections Section including closed stack and rare book collections.

RESEARCH CORNER

Alerting Services

₩ What?

Alert Services (also known as Alerting Services or Current Awareness Services) are services used to keep us up to date with the latest references, journal articles, or books in the researchers' areas of interest.

* Who?

They are particularly useful for researchers, especially for research which extends over a long period, e.g., working towards a dissertation or thesis.

→ How?

Many of the databases, which the Library subscribes to, provide the option of setting up an alerting service. It is necessary to register with a database or publisher site in order to set up an alert.

* Form of Delivery?

Notification of new research information will be delivered in the form of either regular email alerts or RSS (Real Simple Syndication) feeds. Depending on individual database, alerts may be in the form of:

- TOC alert: table of contents of newly released journal issues, e.g., in ACM Digital Library and RSC Journals;
- Search alert: recent articles matching previously submitted searches, e.g., in CSA databases and Journals@Ovid;
- <u>Citation alert:</u> get alert when the article you specified is cited by another article, e.g., in Scopus & Web of Science.

* Availability?


PROFILE

• Project Report: New Facilities Trial Zone

As part of the Library Revitalization Project, new furniture and 85 new research carrels will be available for use in March/April 2011. To ensure the design of these facilities meet the expectation of our users, the Library had set up a "New Facilities Trial Zone" with display boards about the Project at the future location of the Cafe Area from mid-October to the end of November 2010. A number of new facilities and furniture were put on display for users' comments:

- * Real size research carrel mock-ups;
- * Single seater sofa and coffee table;
- * Stackable chairs for the Exhibition Area;
- * Gas-lift chair for both the G/F and 3/F;
- * 120 degree workstation for the IT Lounge;
- * L-shaped desk for the research carrel;
- * Foldable rectangular desk and trapezium table with castors for the User Education Rooms.

Users were invited to try on those furniture and indicate their preferences by casting their votes at the computer kiosk set-up there or email their comments to our Suggestion Box.
